Becker's Hospital Review assesses the data compiled by Chartis and, based on required criteria, determines the final list of Top 100 Critical Access Hospitals across the nation. This is the industry's most comprehensive and objective assessment for rural hospital performance.

The INDEX represents the industry's most comprehensive and objective assessment of rural hospital performance. By leveraging publicly available data, the INDEX evaluates a hospital's performance across several metrics, including inpatient market share, outpatient market share, quality, outcomes, patient perspective, cost, charges, and finance. Combined, Reeves Regional Health scored 94.2 out of 100.
